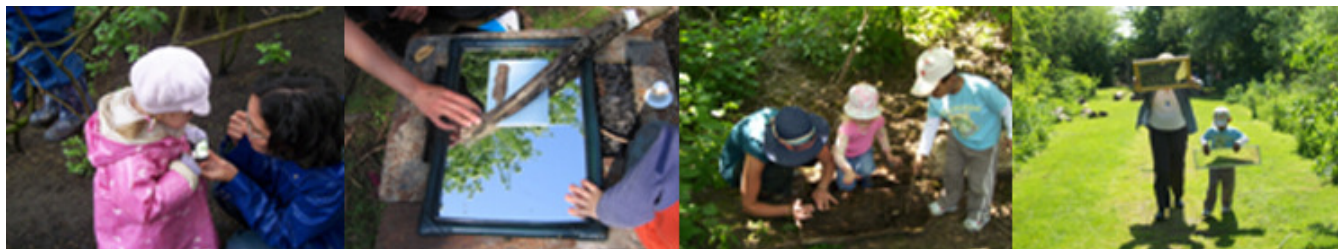

**Deb Winfield** (Cambridge Steiner School) will explore the setting up of the region's first outdoor nursery at Wandelbury Country Park and Nature Reserve, south Cambridge.

**James Newell** and **Vanessa Lindsay** from Two Village Primary School, Harwich, will introduce their Garden of Curiosity and the work that happens there in the foundation stage and throughout the school.

Organised by Cambridge Curiosity and Imagination and Sightlines Initiative, the conference builds on three key principles:

The need to support children's ideas, creativity, enquiries and fascination with the world

The need for collaborative practice – educators, parents and children working together

The need for a continuous cycle of observation, reflection and action
